EASY recipe


- Spaghetti Sauce
- 1 Loaf Frozen Bread Dough
- Mustard
- Pepperoni
- Browned Hamburger
- Canadian Bacon
- 1 Bag Mozzarella Cheese
- Oil
- Oregano

Thaw frozen bread dough. When thawed roll out to a 15'x12" rectangle. Spread thin layer of mustard over half of the dough. Next, layer pepperoni, hamburger, Canadian bacon, & cheese over mustard. Fold remaining dough over all ingredients & seal up the edges. Brush with oil & sprinkle with oregano. Bake @ 400° for 25–30 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool slightly before cutting. Serve in 1-inch slices & dip into warm spaghetti sauce.

BE ON THE Lookout

Gift card scams have been an issue for a few years now, and

it seems they are making a comeback. A gift card scam will typically start with a phone call telling the victim they owe money for a debt or to help someone they know get out of trouble. The scammer will then tell the victim to immediately buy a gift card that can be used to pay them off. The caller of the scam can claim to be from anywhere; the government, a private company, etc. After you purchased a gift card for them, they will want you to scratch the codes off and give them the numbers. By doing this, it is impossible to get your money back. Once those numbers are given to them, your money is gone!

WHAT TO DO

Remember to take a breath and think about the phone call you are receiving. It is a red flag if someone is demanding payment. Always remember to hang up the phone and call the number you have on file for that specific place or person who may be in trouble.



HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM FRAUD

- always know that scams DO exist
- if you are dealing with someone online, make sure you know who it is in real life
- do not open suspicious links, attachments, or pop-up windows in an e-mail.
- Look the company up through an online search or the phone book. DO NOT use the contact details sent in the message if you suspect a scam.
- Don't respond to calls regarding access to your computer (do so only if you called a company for help FIRST)
